



INSTALLATION


Customer Information: The information in this installation instruction is intended for use only by skilled technicians who have the proper tools, equipment, and training to correctly and safely add equipment to your vehicle. These procedures should not be attempted by “do-it-yourselfers.”

NOTE: Do not damage the vehicle body paint finish.

1. Make sure you have the anti-theft code for the audio unit and navigation unit (if equipped), then write down the radio station presets.
2. Disconnect the negative cable from the battery.

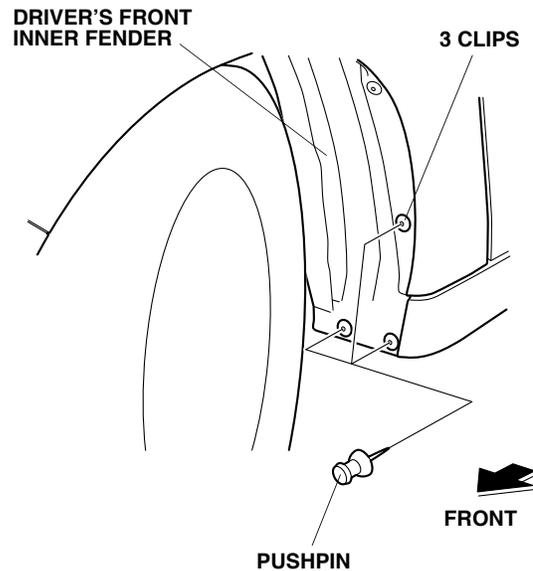
Installing the Front Splash Guards

3. Turn the steering wheel fully counterclockwise.




4. With the vehicle on a lift, locate the indent on the bottom of the driver's side sill trim as shown.
5. While wearing eye protection, drill the mark on the left side sill trim with a 4 mm drill bit, then enlarge the hole with a 10 mm drill bit. Remove any burrs.
NOTE: To prevent damage to the inner vehicle parts, wrap tape around the drill bit 10 mm away from the tip as shown.


6. Using a pushpin, pierce the center of the three clips on the driver's front inner fender.



7. Install the left front splash guard to the driver's front inner fender with three 5 x 25 mm self-tapping screws in the order 1 → 2 → 3.
NOTE: Make sure that the splash guard is secured properly.



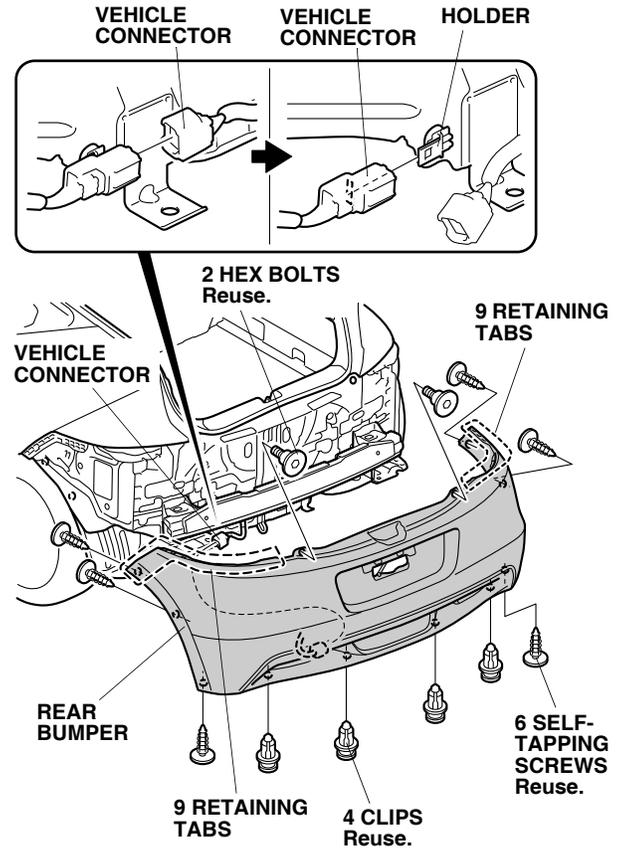
8. Secure the left front splash guard to the driver's side sill trim with one clip.
NOTE: Check that there is no gap between the left front splash guard and vehicle. If there is a gap or a flapping noise from the left front splash guard, adjust the gap and re-tighten the self-tapping screws.



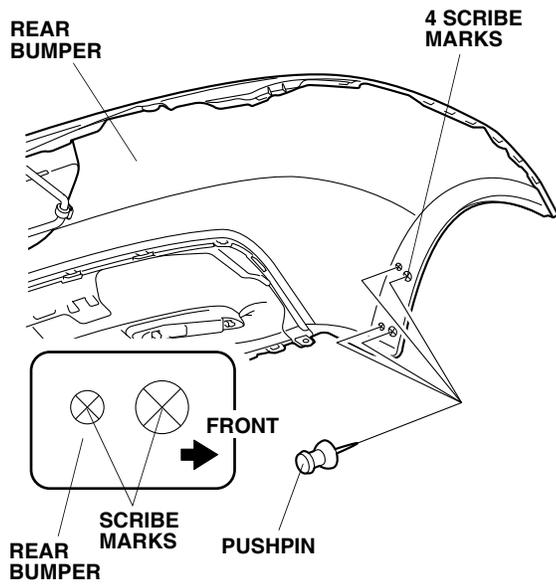
9. Turn the steering wheel all the way clockwise and repeat steps 4 through 8 to install the right front splash guard.

Installing the Rear Splash Guards

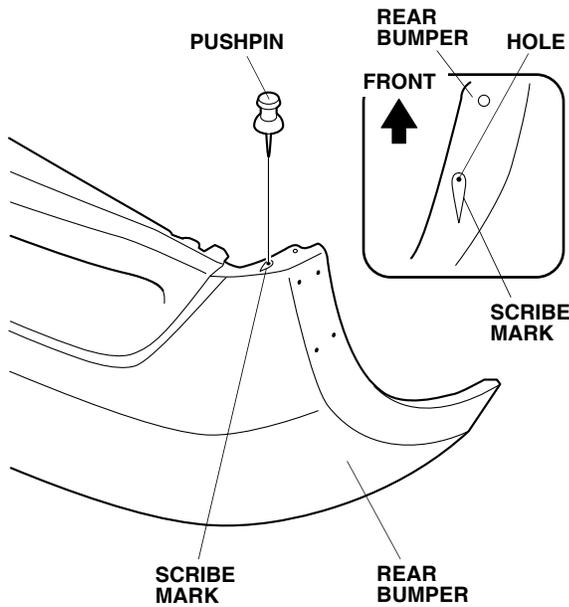
10. Open the hatch.
11. Remove the rear bumper (six self-tapping screws, two hex bolts, four clips, eighteen retaining tabs, unplug the vehicle connector, and release the vehicle connector from the holder).
NOTE: Have an assistant help you when removing the rear bumper. Place the rear bumper on a blanket after removal.




12. Using a pushpin, pierce the center of the four scribe marks on the rear bumper as shown.
NOTE: Chalk the scribe mark to make it more visible.



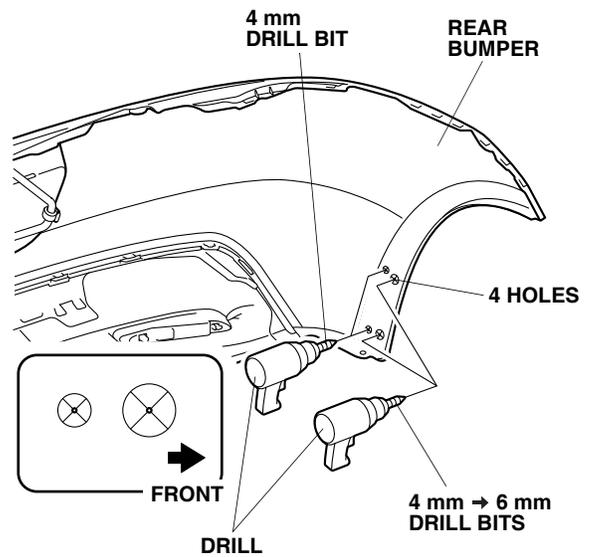
13. Using a pushpin, pierce the center of one scribe mark on the bottom of the rear bumper as shown.



14. While wearing eye protection, drill the hole on the rear bumper with a 4 mm drill bit, then enlarge the hole with a 6 mm drill bit. Remove any burrs.




15. Drill the four holes on the rear bumper with a 4 mm drill bit.




16. Enlarge the two front holes on the rear bumper with a 6 mm drill bit. Remove any burrs.


17. Align and install two brackets to the rear bumper with two 5 x 18 mm self-tapping screws.
NOTE: Make sure that there is no clearance between the bracket and rear bumper.




18. Repeat steps 12 through 17 on the right side of the rear bumper.
19. Using a utility knife, cut along the two scribe lines on the driver's rear inner fender.



20. Using a utility knife, cut off the tab from the driver's rear inner fender as shown.

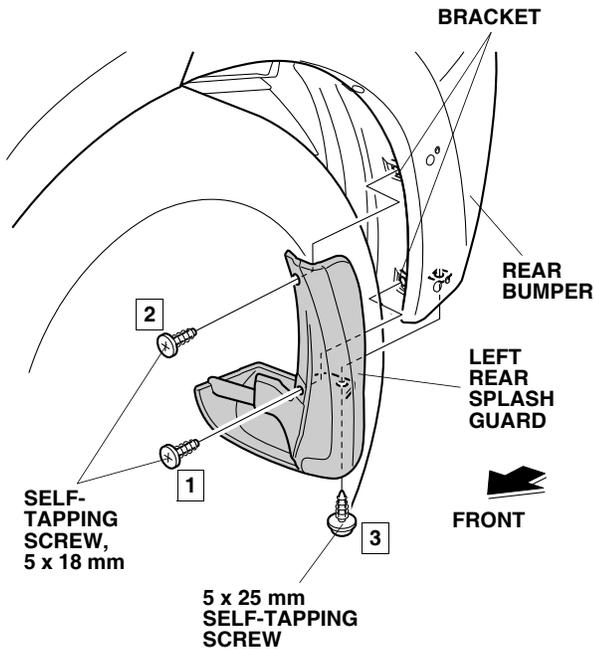


21. Install one spring nut to the hole on the driver's rear inner fender.



22. Repeat steps 19 through 21 on the right side of the vehicle.
23. With the help of an assistant, reinstall the rear bumper.

24. Install the left rear splash guard onto the two brackets and the left rear inner fender with two 5 x 18 mm self-tapping screws and one 5 x 25 mm self-tapping screw.



25. While holding the splash guard firmly against the bumper tighten the self-tapping screws in the order shown.
26. Repeat the same procedure on the right side of the vehicle.
NOTE: Make sure that the splash guard is secured properly. Check that there is no gap between the left rear splash guard and vehicle. If there is a gap or a flapping noise from the left rear splash guard, adjust the gap and re-tighten the self-tapping screws.

27. Reconnect the negative cable to the battery.
28. Enter the customer's anti-theft code for the audio and navigation system (if equipped), and reset the radio station presets.
29. Reset the clock.
30. If the IMA battery level gauge display is at zero, start the engine, and hold it between 3,500 and 4,000 rpm (without load) in P or N position until the IMA battery level gauge display shows at least half-charged.
